The Garden

Each week, during we have 10 - 30 volunteers come and help our Garden Manager maintain our lovely garden. Volunteers assist on Thursdays anytime between 9am – 12noon.

Jobs include:

- Propagation
- Path maintenance
- Caring for chooks, ducks and worms
- Garden projects
- Pruning
- Fixing tools
- Sweeping
- Cooking
- Weeding



Events

We host a number of weekend workshops, open gardens and educational experiences that may require the support of volunteers.

Jobs may include garden guides, set-up and pack-up, baristas, food preparation, photography, IT support and more.
