Board Report

2024 marked seven years of ErinEarth as an independent not-for-profit, an opportunity to reflect on our progress and reaffirm our direction. It was a year of consolidation, as our strategic planning process refined our vision into a clear and purposeful statement: A Healed Earth.

Our education programs grew significantly, reaching more students and schools than ever before. A major highlight was the success of our KHS 7A partnership, which inspired the launch of our new "Connect to Nature" programs. Unlike traditional one-off sessions, these immersive experiences encourage deeper, more lasting connections between students and the natural world.

Meanwhile, we expanded community engagement by complementing our well-loved Open Days with monthly workshops, offering new opportunities for learning and advocacy. These initiatives reflect our commitment to responding to the needs of our times, staying true to the example set by our founders in fostering a community for Earth awareness, reconnection, and reflection.

The extension of our garden boundary was the focus of our 2024 infrastructure improvements. This enabled the building of a Stormwater Biofiltration System—a major sustainability project that now serves as a demonstration model during our garden tours. ErinEarth has always believed that our garden is our classroom, and this initiative strengthens our ability to showcase sustainable solutions. This project was made possible through the generous support of local businesses and Rotary clubs, highlighting the power of community collaboration.

Building strong relationships remains at the heart of our work. In 2024, we forged new partnerships while strengthening existing ones. A particularly meaningful connection was established with the Kapooka Indigenous Army Recruits program, deepening our ties with the local Indigenous community and broadening our shared commitment to environmental stewardship.

ErinEarth's true strength lies in its people—our passionate staff and dedicated volunteers. Ranging in age from 13 to 91, our volunteers bring a wealth of skills, from pruning and propagating to policy writing and governance. Contributions from these extraordinary people make ErinEarth an impactful community organisation. We thank our volunteers and are profoundly grateful for their time, energy, and commitment.

We also acknowledge the Nagle Trust Fund, managed by the Presentation Sisters of Wagga Wagga, for their generous financial support. Their legacy, along with that of our founders, remains a guiding light, a lantern of hope for the future.

As we look to 2025, we are poised for growth and impact. With the implementation of our new strategic plan, our focus will be on measuring the effectiveness of our evolving education framework and developing strategic funding priorities to ensure ErinEarth's long-term sustainability.

Together, we look forward to another year of learning and transformation—for our community and for A Healed Earth.
